

Volunteer needs for Seattle Rueda, Spring 2012 and ongoing

Guidelines and Peer Teaching Guidance Committee

Duties:

- Initial role: Together or in subcommittees, creates a set of guidelines for each of the following:
 - 1) Guidelines for peer-to-peer teaching in the “dance” circle, i.e., how to present a step
 - 2) Guidelines for running the “instruction” circle, i.e., how to manage this circle and what/how to teach in it
 - 3) List of survival skills needed to dance in the “dance circle”
 - 4) Potentially, guidelines for calling in the “dance” circle, i.e., incorporating calls taught in recent weeks, working on the choreographic aspect of calling
- Ongoing roles:
 - Ensures that there are at least three people who attend practica regularly who can manage the “instruction” circle. May also periodically run a closed workshop on “instruction circle” management, and advise “instruction circle” managers.
 - Periodically runs an open workshop on peer-to-peer teaching. May advise peer-teachers, after they present a step, on what in their teaching went well or needs improvement.
 - May also work with callers to ensure they are calling recently taught steps, work with circle managers and callers on incorporating awareness of technique into the practica, and ensure there are people modeling that advanced dancers can learn from dancing in the “instruction circle.”

Number of people: 3 or 4 with a strong commitment.

Time frame: Immediate work needed. Then a smaller ongoing role

NOTE: There will also be a need for 2 to 3 additional people who are qualified to manage the “instruction circle” and run it according to the guidelines that this committee writes. Please let Betsy or Kyra know if want to do this. As this is an ongoing need, please also let us know if you would like to develop this skill.
